# THE ECB/ESCA 20/20 OVERS COMPETITION - PROPOSALS FOR 2011

## Object

To continue the successful national 20/20 competition, building on the ESCA county based competition.

## Organisation

1. To move from the county based competition through regional rounds and then to a National Finals Day.
2. Finalists to be the winners of the four ECB/ESCA regions.
3. The continuation of the 4 county based competitions leading to County Finals.
4. The establishment of 4 Regional Competitions leading to Regional Finals.
5. The establishment of a successful Vase Competition - county based initially.
6. Format of the Finals Day  
4 Regional Winners  
2 Semi-Finals  
Semi-final winners play in Grand Final  
Teams play 12 aside
7. The final to be played at Arundel.
8. Financial Implications (Budget)
  - i) Funding for National Finals
  - ii) Funding for Regional Competition
  - iii) Funding for County Cup Competition and County Finals
  - iv) Funding for Vase Competition, also leading to Vase Finals

### County Grants Based on 40 Counties

£50 Basic + incremental for increased entries as follows:

10-20 teams	£50
21-30 "	£100
31-40 "	£125
41-50 "	£175
51+ "	£200

If Vase Competition continues after first round of cup competitions then extra £50, eg, for County with 31-40 teams then grant will be £50 + £125 = £175.

If Vase Competition then + £50 = £225

County Final + £50

Vase Final + £50

. . . Grand Total for one county = £325

This will include Umpires food etc for County Cup and Vase Finals

Certificate for Counties £250

County Costs, Grants etc, based on present figures

10 @ £325 = £3,250

11 @ £250 = £2,750

11 @ £300 = £3,300

3 @ £400 = £1,200

7 @ £50 = £350

Extra money on servicing the sponsorship deal and any extra advertising plus National Final costs.

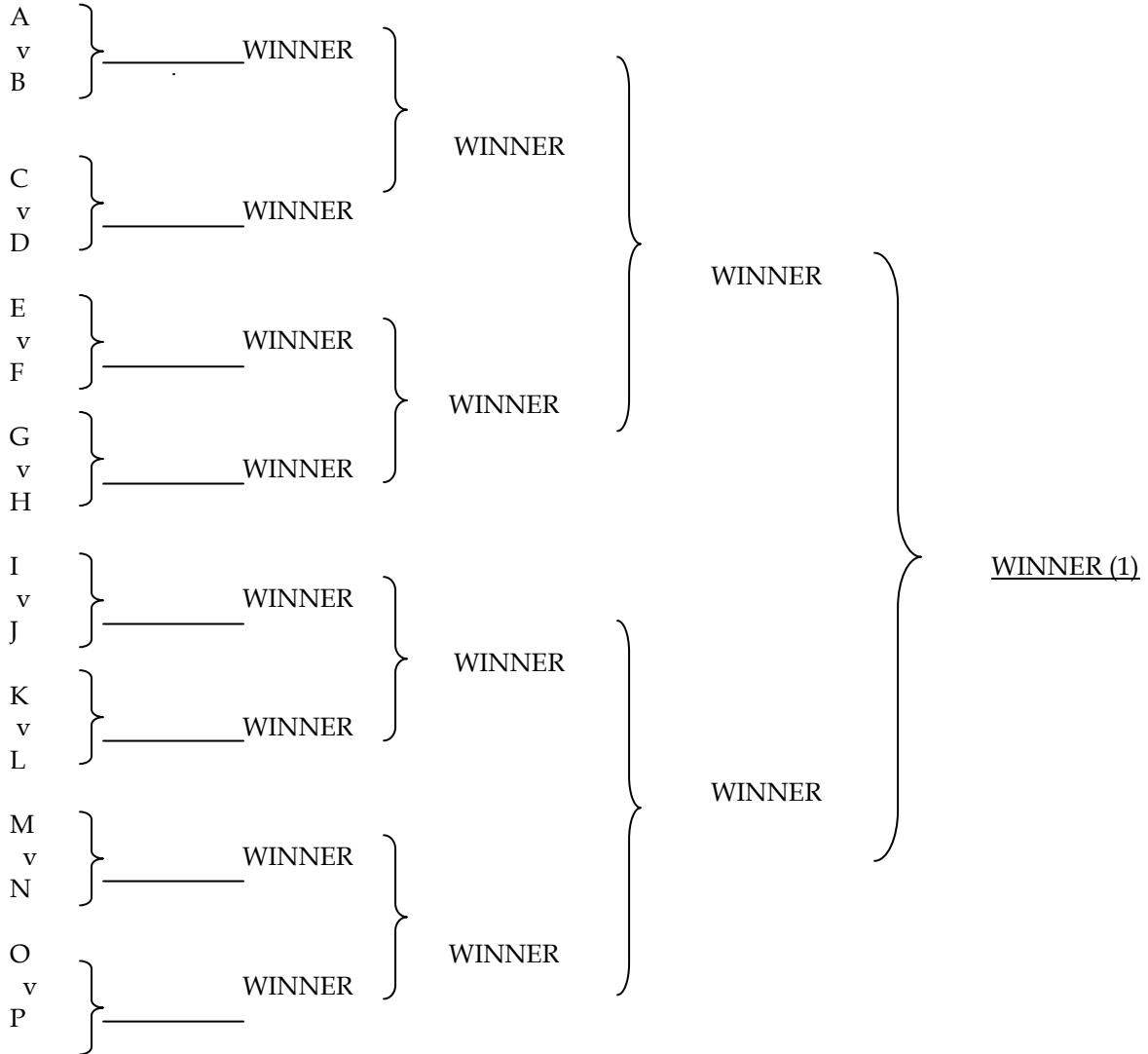

Repeat to get 2<sup>nd</sup> County Finalist (2)

Then 1 v 2 = County Final

Must be finished by 20 June

Winner goes through to Regional Competition, one of four competitions

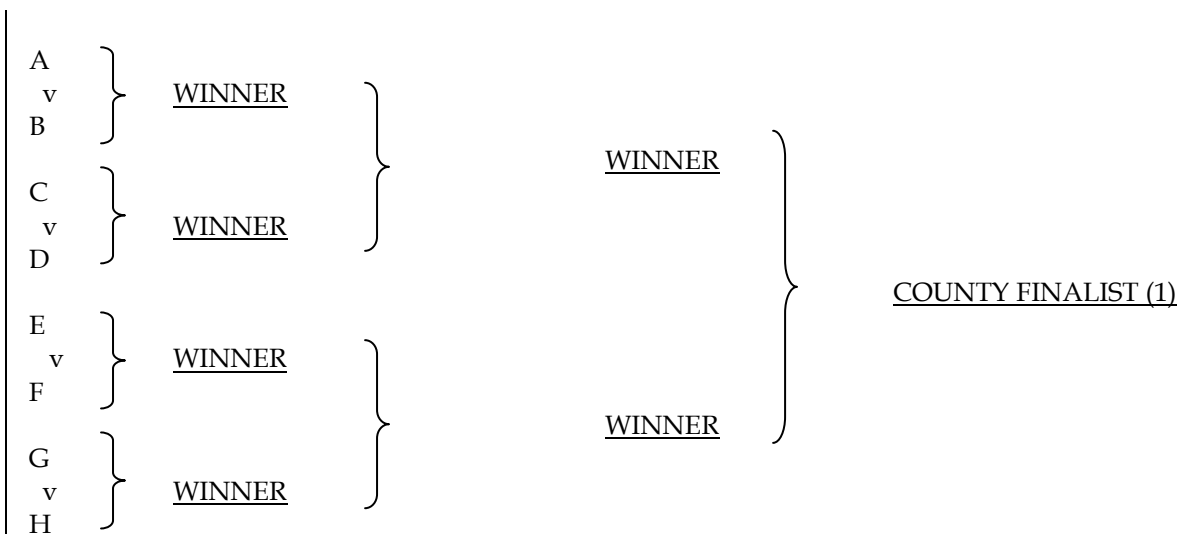

Vase Competition in Counties only initially

Vase after 1<sup>st</sup> Round of Cup Competitions

Based on 32 Teams 2 x 8 Sub-sets



Repeat 2<sup>nd</sup> 8 to get County Finalist (2)

Therefore County Vase Finalist will be Winner 1 v Winner 2

This Competition can be spread further over the season.

### **County Rounds**

### **Regional Rounds**

Regional Final on or before 16 July

Earlier Regional Rounds leading to Final  
on or before 26 June  
And on or before 6 July

One team to National Final on September 8<sup>th</sup> - Arundel

Organised per region by Regional Coordinator who will liaise with Counties

### **Vase Competition**

Teams knocked out in the first round will continue in the Vase Competition which can continue until July.

Vase Competition will be a County Competition for 2011.

### **County Round Draw**

Each county will have to provide a draw for its competition(s), which will act as your registration.

**20/20 COMPETITION**  
**PLAYING REGULATIONS - COUNTY ROUNDS**

The Laws of Cricket (including the size of bat, ball and wicket and length of pitch) will apply, with the following exceptions:-

- 1.(a) The length of the innings shall be 20 overs. The Final will be of 20 overs per side. One hour and fifteen minutes allowed to bowl the 20 overs.
  - (b) Each side must face 5 overs to constitute a match.
  - (c) A new ball will be provided for each innings.
2. No player may bowl more than 4 overs (reduced proportionately for reduced over matches).
3. If a bowler breaks down, the remainder of the over will be bowled by another bowler. Such part of an over will count as a full over when working out each bowler's limit.
4. The side which scores the most runs shall be the winner.
5. If the scores are level, the side which has lost the least wickets shall be the winner.
6. If the scores continue level, the winner shall be the side, in order:-
  - (a) which has the higher score over the first 10 overs of the innings
  - (b) which loses the least number of wickets in the first 10 overs of the innings
7. If the scores are still level a bowl out will take place. Toss of a coin by Captains will be a last option.
- 8.(a) If rain curtails a match, the winner shall be the side scoring most runs in the first 10 overs of the innings, or 9, 8, 7, 6 down to 5.
  - (b) Rain affected games. Overs will be deducted at the rate of one per 3.75 minutes to a minimum of 5 overs per side.
  - (c) In the case of a match in which the second innings is reduced, and provided that five overs have been bowled in the second innings, the winner will be the side with the highest **net run rate** over the same period in the semi-finals and final.

Note: The ESCA/ECB regulations concerning CLOSE FIELDERS and Helmets will apply in all matches.

The ECB would like the following: Sight Screen - A White sight screen will be used in the National Final. A red ball will be used. This is confirmed. Coloured clothing will not be provided. White pads will be used.

The National Final will not be re-arranged.
